Pour écouter

You will hear several statements and determine whether the statement is in the past tense or the present tense.

Pour lire

You will read two passages. One passage is a story, the other is a dialogue. You will see the past tense used in both of these.

Pour écrire

There will be a series of sections where you will complete sentences with the passé composé of the verbs given. You will need to know how to form regular past participles, the irregular past participles and when to use être as the helping verb. **Also, make sure to know how to form negative sentences in the passé composé.** Remember that the negative expressions surround the helping verb!!

There will be a writing section on this exam. You will see an itinerary for a trip to France. You will need to write a post card to tell a friend about what you did during this trip.
